IMPORTANT NOTICE #1

JWA Tiedown Licensees,

The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) now requires all parties at commercial airports with unescorted access authority to the AOA to submit to a Security Threat Assessment (STA) and receive an airport-issued photo identification badge. This new requirement is part of TSA Security Directive 1542-04-08F.

Compliance on your part requires you and any co-owner pilot(s) of your aircraft to submit information for a Security Threat Assessment (STA) to the JWA I.D./Access Control office (see attached forms). After submitting the STA information to the Airport, completing an identification badge application, and showing us documents (in person) that verify 1) your identity and 2) legal status in the U.S. (see attachment), we will upload this information to TSA and verify you have "cleared" the STA process before an Airport Operations Area ("AOA") photo identification badge is issued to you. *Note-This process requires two visits to the JWA I.D./Access Control office in the Terminal Building so we can verify your application with identification/legal status documents first, then to take your identification badge photo. Public parking (except valet) will be validated for this purpose when you bring your parking ticket with you to our office. The JWA I.D./Access Control office is located at the Thomas Riley Terminal building on the lower level outside and adjacent to the American Airlines Baggage office.

The deadline for compliance with this Security Directive is **March 1, 2009**. After this date, vehicle hangtag access media that is issued by the Airport will no longer open AOA vehicle gates, however, the hangtags will still need to be displayed in parked vehicles while on the airfield.

This new identification badge will open a vehicle gate using a 4-digit personal identification number (PIN) that you select that is entered on the pad at the gate where the badge is presented. AOA badge holders will need to show their new identification badge and pilot's license or General Aviation Driver's permit to access the AOA through a vehicle gate.

An FBO or other AOA tenant will need to verify possession of your AOA identification badge if you are authorized to access the AOA through a JWA tenant facility with their consent.
